












Looking Ahead: Courthouse COVID-19 Preventative Measures

		Current	What's Changing?
Active COVID-19 entrance screening		Active screening must be completed by all individuals (including staff and members of judiciary) entering a courthouse	Active screening will no longer be required when entering a courthouse, beginning April 4, 2022 Individuals self-screen at home and not attend a courthouse if sick
Mandatory Face Coverings		All individuals are required to wear ministry provided face coverings in all locations of a MAG facility	Public are no longer required to wear face coverings within the courthouse, beginning March 21, 2022 Masking continues to be recommended - individuals may continue to wear their own face coverings in the courthouse Masks will be available at the entrance, if required Ministry staff are required to wear face coverings until April 4, 2022 , after which time they will be optional
Hand hygiene and readily available hand sanitizer		Frequent and proper hand hygiene must be undertaken	Hand sanitizer will continue to be available and hand hygiene is recommended

Plexiglass barriers		Plexiglass barriers are in place where physical distancing cannot be maintained	Plexiglass barriers will gradually be removed from courtrooms over several months Locations where plexiglass may impede the ability for matters to proceed will be prioritized for urgent removal
Enhanced cleaning		Enhanced cleaning performed once per day	Enhanced cleaning will continue where operationally feasible
Facility and room maximum capacity limits		Maximum occupancy limits were removed throughout the courthouse as of March 1, 2022	Maximum occupancy and capacity limits no longer in place
Daily indoor air quality monitoring		Indoor air quality monitoring and HVAC system maintenance in both government owned and leased courthouses	Indoor air quality monitoring and HVAC system maintenance in both government owned and leased courthouses
